

Dear Neighbor,

On May 28, 2021, Mississippi Highway Patrol Trooper John Harris was killed performing a routine traffic stop. Shortly after exiting his squad vehicle, Trooper Harris was struck and killed by a tractor trailer. His death, like so many others, could have been prevented had the tractor trailer driver followed the Move Over Law.

The Move Over Law requires drivers to move over at least one lane when approaching stopped emergency vehicles, and other vehicles displaying warning lights, from behind. That includes sanitation, road and bridge maintenance or construction vehicles.

In Florida, since 2015, there have been 1,483 crashes, 116 serious injuries, and 7 deaths as a direct result of drivers not moving over.

Help protect those who protect us:

- Safely move over on roads with two or more lanes;
- Use your signals to alert other drivers that you're moving over; and
- Allow other drivers to move over ahead of you.
