

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS

You may qualify for one or more property tax exemptions including:

Homestead - If you own and live in a property in Orange County as of January 1, you can reduce the assessed value by up to \$50,000, saving about \$750 in taxes annually.

\$5,000 Widow/Widower - Florida widows/widowers who own property in Orange County and are permanent residents as of January 1.

\$5,000 Disability - Disabled Florida residents who own property in Orange County and are permanent residents as of January 1.

Limited Income Senior - Seniors with a homestead exemption and a household income below the state limit.

Limited Income Senior Plus - Seniors with long-term residency who meet income and filing requirements.

HOW ARE TAXES COLLECTED?

Separate governing entities, each held accountable by residents they serve, set tax rates and determine property values:

Tax Rates are Set

The Boards of County Commissioners, School Board, and other entities set a tax rate based on expected needs.

Property Values are Determined

The Property Appraiser determines the taxable value of all real property in Orange County and approves all applicable exemptions.

Taxes are Collected

Our office mails tax bills, collects the taxes, and distributes revenue to 63 taxing authorities in Orange County.

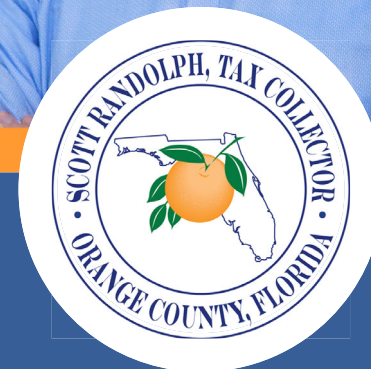

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TAXES COLLECTED & DISTRIBUTED

The Orange County Tax Collector's Office manages the collection and distribution of more than \$3.8 billion in tax revenue and fees for more than 60 different taxing authorities. These funds support essential local services such as law enforcement, fire and rescue, public schools, and libraries.

Operating at no additional cost to taxpayers, the Tax Collector's Office is self-sustained through the fees it collects. Each year, any surplus from the office's budget is returned to local governments, enhancing community services.

With a professional workforce of more than 350 highly-trained employees across six locations, the office processes approximately 3 million transactions annually.
